HIGHLIGHTS @ CSUSM

- In its "Safest Schools" report, National Council for Home Safety and Security recognized CSUSM as the safest four-year university in California.
- Our faculty drive the national research agenda. In 2017, we received approximately \$19.2 million in grants.
- CSUSM, in partnership with Palomar College, received a \$1.95 million grant to develop a five-year program aimed at increasing the number of undergraduates, transfer students and graduates in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) disciplines.
- The curriculum is focused on writing, critical thinking and collaborative team building skills while integrating an international perspective.

SUPPORT SERVICES

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS

- CSUSM is a stop on a "Sprinter" light rail service that connects to bus and train routes throughout San Diego and California.
- Special student discount passes are available for reliable public transport to neighboring cities.
- Other modes of transportation are available to allow for easy commutes to campus and travel throughout the region, including express bus service, zip cars for rent and ride-share services.

- Official transcripts/academic records from all secondary and post-secondary schools attended
- Affidavit of Financial Support or scholarship letter
- Official TOEFL, IELTS or Cambridge score report, if required
- Copy of passport
- Non-refundable application fee of \$55 USD

MASTER'S DEGREE APPLICANTS

In addition to the materials listed above, graduate applicants may be required to submit the following:

- Department application, as required
- GRE or GMAT scores, as required
- Letters of Recommendation, as required
- Statement of purpose, as required
- Resume, as required

- October 1 through May 1
- All documents must be received by May 1

Spring Filing Period:

- August 1 through November 1
- All documents must be received by November 1

IN COUNTRY (ALREADY HERE IN THE U.S.) APPLICANTS:

Fall Filing Period:

- October 1 through June 1
- All documents must be received by June 1

Spring Filing Period:

- August 1 through November 1
- All documents must be received by November 15



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

BACHELOR'S DEGREE

Freshman (First-Time) Student:

- Equivalent of a "B" (3.0) GPA in high school 2.7 GPA out of 4.0 for conditional admission through ALCI
- Graduated from, or will graduate with a secondary diploma/ graduation certificate (IB diploma accepted)
- SAT or ACT recommended, but not required
- Advanced Placement (AP), College Level Examination
 Program (CLEP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) credit
 accepted for transfer credit

Transfer Student:

■ CSUSM accepts both lower and upper division transfer students with a GPA of 2.0 or higher out of 4.0

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

CAN BE SATISFIED WITH ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- TOEFL score of 61 iBT with writing score no lower than 19 and no section score below 14
- IELTS score of 5.5 with writing score no lower than 5.5 and no section score below 5.0
- Cambridge B2 First (FCE), C1 Advanced (CAE), C2
 Proficiency (CPE) no lower than 168. (no lower than 160 for pathway program)
- Depending on location, students with a minimum of three years of study at a institution where English is the principal language of instruction
- Requirement may be waived by completing an approved freshmen Composition course from an accredited US institution with grade of "C" or better

MASTER'S DEGREE

- Equivalent of a Bachelor's Degree
- Overall 2.5 GPA out of 4.0 in the general degree or in the last 60 units attempted
- Many graduate programs have higher than minimum GPA requirements. Some will require GRE, GRE subject tests or GMAT, depending on the program.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Can be satisfied with ONE of the following:

- TOEFL score of 80 iBT
- IELTS score of 6.0 with writing score no lower than 6.0 and no section score below 5.5
- Cambridge C1 Advanced (CAE), C2 Proficiency (CPE) no lower than 180
- Bachelor's or Master's degree from a U.S. university or country where English is the principal language of instruction

Conditional Admission applies to both bachelor's degree and master's degree

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

Conditional admission is available to Bachelor's degree and select Master's degree applicants who are academically qualified, but need a passing TOEFL or IELTS score.

- Applicants may satisfy their English language requirement by successfully completing the American Language and Culture Institute's (ALCI) University Access Program for the TOEFL/IELTS-waiver
- Conditionally admitted students may be permitted to take university classes for credit while enrolled in ALCI
- Students who successfully complete ALCI will be admitted to CSU San Marcos without a TOEFL/IELTS score for the following term
- Master's Conditional Admission applicants must have the undergraduate English proficiency level requirement at time of application.

NO TOEFL OR IELTS SCORE IS REQUIRED FOR ALCI CONDITIONAL ADMISSION FOR BACHELOR SEEKING STUDENTS.
